

## Secondary School Lesson for International Day of Peace, Sept. 2013

The Day After Peace film lesson.

**TOPIC:** Introduction of the origin and meaning of the international day of peace.

**LENGTH:** One or more class periods of approximately 70 minutes. **SOURCE:** Peace One Day Global Education Resources, pages 12-13.

Students should be able to:

- Describe how Jeremy Gilley established Sept. 21 as an annual Peace Day
- Explain the meaning of war, ceasefire and non-violence
