

NO MILITARY TRAINING IN SASKATCHEWAN HIGH SCHOOLS PETITION TO PREMIER BRAD WALL

Regina high schools, both public and Catholic, will soon be offering a military training program to grade 11 and 12 students during regular school hours. Students will earn two credits for taking the course. They will also be paid \$2,000.

The provincial government is backing this plan, which means that the military training program is also likely to be introduced into schools in other Saskatchewan municipalities. Contrary to current education policy, such a program will ultimately teach that violence is an appropriate method of conflict resolution.

We, the undersigned, call on the Government of Saskatchewan to reverse this plan and, instead, implement a program to educate students about the importance of global peace and non-violent conflict resolution.

All Saskatchewan residents of high school age or older are eligible to sign.
